PRESIDENT REPORT

Hello Members, Coach Developers, Coaches, and Board Members,

The sport system in New Brunswick has seemingly bounced back from what has seemed to be a challenging few years with COVID and its restrictions. As a leader in the province, Coach NB had a fantastic year accomplishing the organization’s strategic initiatives and going beyond to ensure that they provide the necessary services to coaches to excel in the province. It is always important to recognize the efforts and results of the staff of Coach NB, as they are on the “front lines” working with Coach Developers and coaches throughout the province. As such, we welcomed Madeline Belding to the Coach NB staff and community, where she took on the Women in Coaching Program Manager role and moved to NB. This is important work for the NB sports system, where there is a need for female coaches and mentors in the province. Staff members, Gabriel Kim and Andrea Creer, have excelled in their positions and produced outstanding results. Manon Landry Ouellette, as executive director, is the backbone of this organization and has led this organization to another successful year. Congratulations to the staff for all your hard work over the past year.

I would be remiss not to mention that Coach NB faced some challenges in the form of a proposed change. Early in the year, the first phase of the envisioning exercise that was initiated by the Government of NB Sport and Recreation Branch came to a close, where the NB sport system stakeholders were able to see for the first time a copy of the recommendations for systematic improvement to the sport system. One of the recommendations that had a specific impact on the continued operations of Coach NB was the proposal that Coach NB merge with Sport NB to form one “agency.” This proposed merger would have a significant impact on the operations of Coach NB, and, thus, Manon and myself, over the past year, met with the Sport and Recreation Branch representatives, the Government of NB, and the envisioning team to continue to ask questions and keep an open line of dialogue between all parties involved. The Coach NB board, members, Coach Developers, and staff are waiting for the next steps from the Sport and Recreation Branch.

As we enter the 2023-2024 year, there are no signs that Coach NB will be slowing down. The focus for Coach NB board will be to develop a new strategic plan over the next few months.

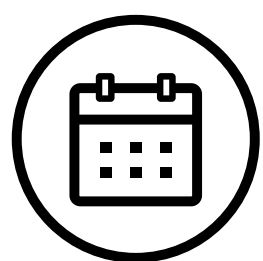

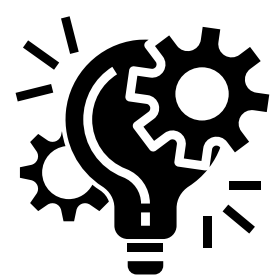

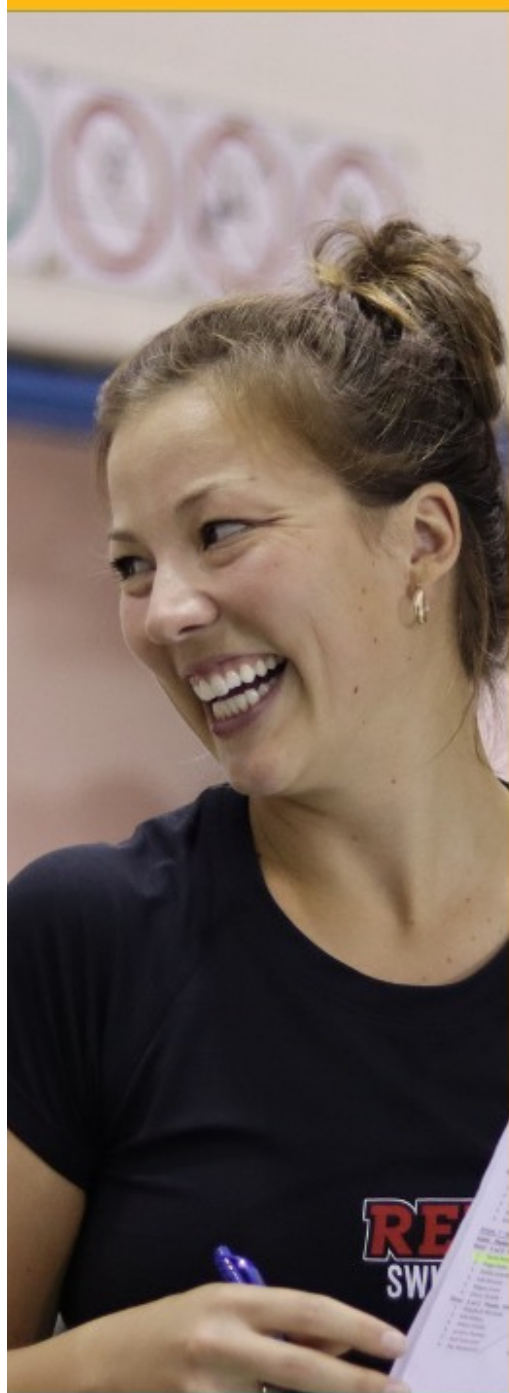
